not have made it this far without it, but 1 2. I do want to be very clear, we continue 3 to lose \$1 million a day to continued low 4 ridership and fare box revenues. Just to put that in context, we normally spend \$4 5 million a day to run our system. 6 7 Federal COVID relief packages passed last year, and the recently signed American 8 9 Rescue Plan may seem like we have 10 sufficient funds to ease the impact of 11 this crisis, but funding we received to date is being used to make up from what 12 13 we're not getting from the fare box. 14 less than one year we've used nearly \$400 15 million of federal funds to cover that \$1 16 million a day deficit and massive 17 additional pandemic-related costs for 18 supplemental cleaning, sanitizing, and 19 supporting and protecting our employees. 20 These additional costs would have been a 21 burden even during a year when finances 22 were strong. 23 During the COVID pandemic, as

our riders stayed home, these costs

further stretched our already depleted budget.

Ridership is expected to return slowly. We hope to reach 80 percent of pre-pandemic ridership levels in the next two years. Our COVID relief money will not last until our ridership returns to a sustainable level, but we must make it last until we recover, and we are working very hard to ensure that happens, and that the future of SEPTA is strong.

One of the issues we are concerned about is the proliferation of the vulnerable population who seek refuge on our system. SEPTA Police and Social Workers are paired up through the SEPTA SAVE Program to get people connected to services.

We are teaming up with other partners to address these issues for the benefit of the vulnerable community, the safety and security of our own employees, and those riding the system. To make sure we can welcome back other customers

to a clean and secure system, we are working aggressively here internally, as well as with external agencies and partners to make sure that happens.

I'd like to close by once again recognizing our front-line employees who go above and beyond to keep our system clean, safe and operating. I also want to thank our employees who keep the business of SEPTA running every day, and throughout this entire pandemic.

We commemorated National

Employee Appreciation Day last week, but
we very much appreciate what our
employees do every single day.

And as we end Women's History
Month, I want to thank all of the women
of SEPTA, as well as to the men who
support us.

The trolleys make up SEPTA's busiest surface routes, hailing more ridership than any big single bus line and most regional rail lines. Our trolley cars are a decade past their 30-year useable life, and are becoming increasingly unreliable.

This is a matter of equity and racial justice because our trolley lines serve lower-income, higher-minority communities, connecting these neighborhoods to opportunities in Center City and University City. The current trolley cars are also not fully ADA-accessible to people of all ages and abilities.

Our region's trolley
neighborhoods deserve a modern system.
In replacing the aging trolley fleet,
SEPTA has the chance to transform the

trolley system to resemble modern light rail. This means increasing speed and reliability through off-board fare payment, transit signal priority, and stop consolidation.

This project has larger, regional economic benefits. Our functional trolley system is crucial for our region's economic recovery, by serving and connecting people to jobs and amenities.

It's crucial that when it comes to infrastructure spending, we Fix It

First. As secretary of transportation,

Pete Buttigieg, recently commented, "A

lot of what we've got to do is dealing

with a maintenance backlog."

We want SEPTA to prioritize the Trolley Modernization Project by stepping up its timeline and increasing its Capital Budget investment allocation.

Let's keep one of the only unexpected benefits from COVID and move to a future powered by transit, flexible working, and living pattern, and congestions for each street.

Clean Air Council and its
partners at Transit Forward Philadelphia
are calling upon SEPTA, one of the
largest employers and mobility providers
in the region, to demonstrate leadership
in transportation demand management by
adopting a permanent flexible work
policy.

The council is reaching out to employers across the city to now plan a

We also want SEPTA to do its part and prioritize trolley modernization project by increasing its capital budget allocation.

Philadelphia and Delaware County also deserve a signature capital transit project, and we deserve reliable accessible and frequent trolley service within our lifetime. Please do what you can to make sure this happens.
